- Young people within African Caribbean community
- Community nurses – Aylesbury and Wycombe
- Wycombe Wanderers community health
- Mosque leaders – Aylesbury, Wycombe
- African Caribbean community - Wycombe
- Transgender community – Buckinghamshire
- Integrated sensory services - Buckinghamshire

Reducing health inequalities

- Facilitated blood pressure checks at The Disraeli School in High Wycombe and also the mosque in Aylesbury
- Advised CCG on promotion of Improved Access to GP services and helped to promote



Reducing health inequalities

- 1,124 people responded to the Chiltern House Medical Centre survey
- The surgery has a site in Temple End, High Wycombe as well as a previous site in Holmer Green
- Working with the IAG we were able to make sure that our promotion was targeted directly to the right people, specifically through the mosque, university and schools in Wycombe.
