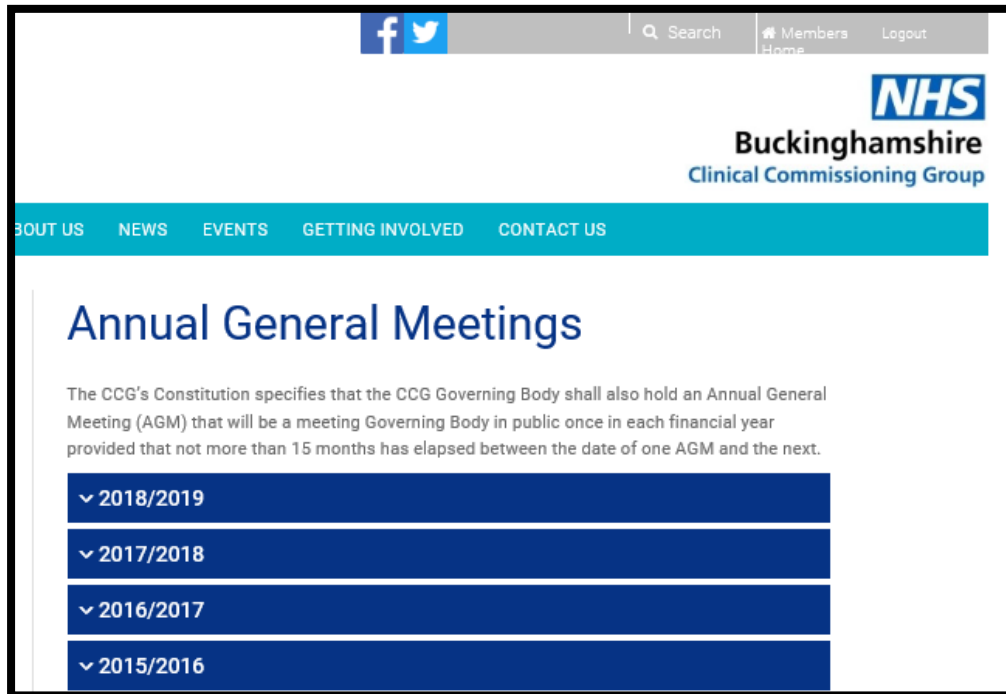

Immediate Bucks CCG Response

Primary Care Workforce Safety

Buckinghamshire CCG has supported innovation and technology in primary care to support remote working:

- Conversion to electronic prescribing
- Telephone and video consultations via AccuRx.
- Laptops for clinicians who are shielding

Primary Care Workforce Safety

- Development of **'Hot hub'** sites at Wycombe and Stoke Mandeville hospital.
- A **visiting service** for frail elderly with suspected COVID
- Staff Risk assessment templates: BAME staff
- Development of Bucks PPE emergency supplies warehouse

COVID related key issues contributing to widening of the inequalities gap

- Economic well being
- Household food insecurity
- Domestic abuse
- Change in lifestyle behaviours

COVID related key issues contributing to widening of the inequalities gap

- Personal well being and impact on mental health
- Delay in accessing care: delayed presentation of new cases and worsening of existing conditions
- Impact on care home residents and staff

Bucks Integrated Care System (ICP) Clinical Harms Group

- **Key Recommendations / Focus:**
 - Cancer: prevention and early diagnosis
 - Health checks: address underlying issues
 - Vulnerable people: Dementia, Learning disability, mental health, care home residents
 - Second surge plans including increased uptake to flu vaccination, increased support for care homes
 - Pro-active monitoring

- Delegated authority agreed on 12th March 2020 to the Audit Committee to approve the Annual Report and Accounts.
- Further assurance to Governing Body on 11th June 2020.
- Approved by the Audit Committee on 16th June 2020.
- Submitted to NHS England 25 June 2020.
- Published in full on the CCG website 8 July 2020.
- **The accounts were unqualified covering Financial Statements, Regularity including consistency and Value for Money.**

Highlights

- Total allocation of £755 million.
- Achieved an in year surplus of £63k (expenditure is less than the allocation).
- Received £15 million of Commissioner Sustainability Funding (CSF)
- Achieved cash target for the year.
- Achieved the Better Payment Practice Code in paying 95% of undisputed invoices to Non NHS Providers within 30 days.
- Achieved Mental Health Investment Standard.
